The white coat ceremony tradition was started in 1993 by Dr. Arnold Gold, a New York neurologist, who founded the Gold Foundation for Humanism in Medicine – to emphasize the dual responsibilities of professionalism and humanism in health care.

Also, in attendance at the ceremony were many local chiropractic physicians who play a vital role by hosting our students in their private practices for clinical observation right from the first weeks of the first semester of the program – a unique feature of Keiser’s Doctor of Chiropractic program.
